

Call for articles and papers on media issues

Website opinion piece (length approx. 500-1000 words):

It can either be a topic that relates to one or more African countries or a general issue that affects media everywhere. Interested students should submit a short outline of what they would like to write about (50-150 words) **before** proceeding to write the article. *Honorarium: South African Rands 1000,-*

How to submit?

Abstracts should be submitted by the 1st of each month and final articles have to be submitted by the 15th of each month. Articles should be Calibri (Body) size 12, 1.5 line space. Students should only begin writing **after** their proposal has been accepted. Only published articles will be paid for.
